The Government of Grenada has received financing from the GEF Trust Fund, administered by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), toward the cost of the Accelerating the Introduction of Low-Emission and Climate-Resilient Electric Mobility in Grenada project, and intends to apply part of the proceeds for consulting services.

The consulting services ("the Assignment") include the conduct of a gender-sensitive socio-economic analysis of the transition to low-carbon electric mobility in Grenada, with a focus on ensuring a just transition that addresses the needs of men and women in vulnerable communities and provides actionable recommendations for the national strategy. The estimated implementation period is 13 months, with an expected start date of August 2026 through August 2027.

The Ministry of Infrastructure and Physical Development, Public Utilities, Civil Aviation and Transportation now invites eligible individual consultants ("Consultants") to indicate their interest in providing the Assignment. Interested Consultants should submit information demonstrating that they possess the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Assignment.

Consultants may associate with other eligible consultants or firms to enhance their qualifications and experience. In the case of a joint venture or association, the lead member shall be identified and shall remain responsible for the overall delivery of the Assignment.

The selection process will follow the procedures for Individual Consultant Selection as outlined in the Public Procurement Act 39 and Public Procurement Regulations SRO 32.

Main Duties:

- Prepare a gender-sensitive socio-economic analysis identifying the socio-economic impacts of a transition to low-carbon electric mobility and recommendations to ensure a just transition

- Provide recommendations on long-term coordination and impact assessment of the electrification strategy
- Develop socio-economic analysis on men and women of vulnerable communities
- Support preparation of the national strategy and related consultation workshops

The Qualification Criteria are:

- Advanced degree (Master's or higher) in social sciences, economics, gender studies, sustainable development, or a related field
- Experience in socio-economic analysis related to low-carbon mobility transitions
- Experience in projects related to multilateral or international funding agencies and electric mobility
- Technical expertise on electric vehicle safety
- Experience in the development of workshops on electric vehicle safety and accident intervention
- Strong analytical, research, and report-writing skills
- Excellent stakeholder engagement and facilitation skills
- Ability to work effectively with government agencies and international partners
- Strong written and oral communication skills in English
- Familiarity with the SIDS context, preferably in Grenada
